General Elective Credit Select 3 - 4 Credits

This requirement can be met with any "G" course in any area, excluding Area I: Communications and any crosslisted courses, that exceeds the minimum requirement.

## Alternatives for Meeting General Education Requirements

Students taking nine or more credits in a specific subject area, even though the courses are not designated as General Education courses, will have met the general education requirements for that subject area.

Total Credits 32-35

In accordance to state law (Post-Secondary Education Articulation Act), the New Mexico Higher Education Department has established a state-wide model for General Education.

Within the General Education model, is nine credits of electives that will be determined at an institutional level.

The current approved NMSU General Education courses are listed above under each of the six general education areas.

Credit will be treated as transfer credit without a grade but will count toward graduation, and may be used in fulfilling specific curriculum requirements.
